

Phase One On-Site Learning Parent/Guardian/Family Opt-In Form

By selecting On-Site Learning, you and your child are committing to joining staff in abiding by the current public health guidelines which dictate District policies related to reducing the spread of the COVID-19 epidemic. These may include, but are not limited to:

- Screening students for symptoms including fever at home and completing a symptom questionnaire before school or bus entry. Please see the **Student Site Access Guide** and the **Daily Student Symptom Checklist** for more information
- Physical distancing and/or use of physical barriers with limited access to activities for students who cannot maintain physical distancing
- Student's use of masks and possibly other protective gear
- Mandatory handwashing and use of district-approved and provided hand sanitizer upon entering and exiting spaces, as well as other times of day.
- Parents/Guardians (or an emergency contact) will be responsible for promptly picking up a student if that student is exhibiting symptoms that may be caused by COVID-19, such as cough, shortness of breath, headache, fever, chills, repeated shaking with chills, muscle pain, sore throat, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, or new loss of taste or smell.
- Limited access by parents and other visitors to the school campus. Only essential visitors will be allowed onsite.
- Other policies and procedures, as directed by the CDC and/or state and/or regional public health authority

Schools will follow health authority directives to provide thorough cleaning of facilities including high touch areas to ensure a safe and healthy learning environment. The District's website and the student's school-site health office can provide up-to-date information for parents and guardians on what strategies the school is taking to reduce the risk of any individual on a school site becoming infected with the virus that causes COVID-19.

You are also committing to, and providing assurance that, you and your child will abide by the rules and regulations for attendance in a California public school, including required immunizations. Breaches of these rules and regulations may result in a change from on-site learning to online learning for a period of time, as defined by the school district.

Students and Household Members with Underlying Health Conditions

Although the school district is making great efforts to make on-site learning safe for everyone, there is a risk of unmeasurable magnitude, that a student will contract the virus that causes COVID-19 in a school setting. For students with underlying health conditions, it is parents' responsibility to verify with the student's own healthcare provider whether attending school is in the student's best interest, in light of this real risk.

It is also the parent's or guardian's responsibility to first explore with a family healthcare provider whether it is in the household's best interest for that student to choose on-site learning when a household member is at higher risk of serious disease.
